FEES:

Cost per week is \$275.00. A **non-refundable** pre-registration fee of \$50.00 is required with the application, (this is part of the original total). Credit cards are accepted. The fee balance is due the first camp day of the week the child is enrolled. The total fee is acceptable at the time of registration. The camp fee includes all costs of instruction, class materials, admission fees at historical sites, and transportation. Families with three (3) or more participants will receive a 20% discount, (this comes off of balance after deposit).

Purpose of the Camp

The history and heritage of the Mississippi Gulf Coast extends back to the arrival of the French over 300 years ago. The Sea-n-Sail Adventure Camp is a day camp that is designed to bring about a greater awareness of our original history and maritime heritage through a variety of fun and educational activities. The camp is offered by the Maritime & Seafood Industry Museum of Biloxi, Inc., and is open to 6-12 year old students.

Camp Structure

The Sea-n-Sail Adventure Camp consists of a week of activities. Seven sessions will be held during the summer. Daily activities will begin at **8:00** a.m. and end at **4:00** p.m. Monday- Thursday and **1:30** p.m. on Friday. Campers will be grouped according to age: 6-8 and 9-12 year olds. Camp staff for each group will include an instructor and two (2) teaching assistants who are CPR/First Aid certified.

Daily Activities

All daily camp activities will originate at the museum located at 115 1st Street, Biloxi. Campers will be transported by bus to and from all fields of activity. Individual activities will range from one to four hours in duration. Camp activities include a variety of unique hands-on experiences which will make regional history and heritage come alive. The camp will begin with a welcome orientation on Monday morning. At this time, campers will meet staff members and be divided into groups. Campers must provide their own lunch and snacks. At times, lunch will be at a field trip or on board one of the schooners.

CAMP ATTIRE AND NECESSARY ITEMS:

Dress during camp week is casual with shoes required. Rain gear and a change of clothes can be left at the museum, if desired. **We will not stop activities due to rain.** Soft soled shoes are required on sail days. Hats and sunscreen are very important items every day, as well as a **lunch and drinks**. All campers must be signed in AND signed out each day by a parent or guardian specified on Parental/ Guardian Permission Sheet.

All Sea-n-Sail Adventure Campers will take sailing trips aboard one of the Museum's famous replicas of the Biloxi Schooner. Age group 9-12 will take a full day trip to Horn Island through waters fished by Biloxi fisherman for over 200 years. Campers age 6-8 will visit Deer Island during one of their half day sails and learn about marine pollution. During the sail, campers will learn components of sailing a schooner, boating safety and rules of the road, and participate in many sailing activities. Lifejackets are required on all students.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

<u>Shrimping Experience</u> – Campers will experience a living marine adventure on board a shrimp trawler, the *Sailfish* designed to demonstrate the how, why & what is caught by local fishermen.

<u>Model Boat Building</u> – During the program period, campers will learn how wooden boats are constructed. Working in small groups, campers will participate in the designing and building of scale model boats.

<u>Crabbing/Fishing/Cast Netting</u> – Campers will get to see crab pot demonstrations while at the pier complex. All campers will learn and employ the methods of Gulf Coast fishing on actual fishing trips. This includes learning how to throw cast/brail nets as well as learning the importance of these nets to the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

<u>Field Trips</u> – Campers will experience fun and educational field trips along the Gulf Coast. Locations include the Lynn Meadows Discovery Center, the MS Aquarium, the Institute of Marine and Mammal Studies, and swimming to name a few. We will also have storytelling by Native American Grayhawk, and oyster shell painting. Other activities are being planned.

<u>Punch & Cookies Reception/Awards Presentation</u> – On Friday of each week parents, grandparents, and guardians are invited to attend a reception beginning at **1:00** p.m. to see the presentation of trophies and awards for the many camp activities which took place during the week. This takes place at the Maritime & Seafood Industry Museum, 115 First Street, Biloxi.
